#### From the Rector



#### Dear Friends:

Did you know there's a connection between the Holy Spirit and gastronomy? The name Cordon Bleu is now synonymous with fine food and cooking. But it originally referred to the wide blue ribbon from which was hung the Cross of the Holy Spirit, the medal of Chevaliers du Saint-Esprit. This was pre-eminent order of chivalry in pre-Revolutionary France, established by Henri III in 1578 who named after the Holy Spirit to commemorate the fact that he became King of France of the Feast of Pentecost. Over time, the

order came to be known for its lavish dinners to the point that the name Cordon Bleu became a synecdoche for the best in food and hospitality.

On Sunday we'll celebrate the Feast of Pentecost—the birthday of the church. This calls for a party, which is why we're bringing back coffee hour after the 10:30 service. I know that many of you have been waiting for this to return—and for good reason, because coffee hour is about more than coffee. It's about fellowship. It's about having the chance to get to know one another better. It's about the simple joy of giving and receiving hospitality.

All of these things are also signs of the Spirit's movement within ourselves and our community, for it is the Spirit that draws us together in fellowship and love. So at the risk of sounding like a broken record, I hope you'll join us on Sunday. We are slowly building back to the way things used to be—insofar as that is possible these days—and we need you. We need your voice raised in song and prayer and we need your companionship and smile in the pew. And more than needing you, we want you. For the Spirit has given you—has given each of us—particular gifts to be used in service of the Kingdom. So maybe it would be better to say God needs you. God wants you.


Tickets are \$20 each and will be available at the office until 12:00 pm on Friday, June 3. Remaining tickets that are still available will be sold at the door on a first come basis.
