#### From the Rector

In Dorothy Sayers' The Man Who Would Be King, a blind man who has been healed by Jesus says, "I never set eyes on your face before. Faces mean nothing to me. But you look the way you ought to look if you're the man I take you for." Could the same be said of us? Sure, we say that we're Christians and that we love Jesus, but we know that what we say isn't very often manifested in our lives and reflected in our faces. Do we look like the people we profess to be? I suspect that what drives so much maladroit religiosity, and the manic attitudes

people often exhibit as they try to prove—as much to themselves as to anyone else—that they are truly spiritual, God-fearing folk, is that they are unwilling to take time to stop and think and pray and simply *be*.

The story of Jesus' Transfiguration is always told on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. Which means Lent, the season during which we're asked to make conscious and thoughtful efforts to engage in more serious and conscious spiritual practices, is about to begin. Such efforts yield results that are usually subtle and fleeting. Glimpses of transfigured faces tend to be momentary, and the drowsiness of life is hard to slough off. And no matter how hard we try, we're bound to disfigure the face of Christ that shimmers beneath our own hard faces. So we have to continue to be deliberate in our life of prayer and in whatever other spiritual practices we find helpful and enriching. We should carry the disciplines of Lent with us throughout the year—throughout our lives.

This is all the more important because we know all too well that those moments of despair will come when we will say that there is no meaning to life, when we will scoff at the claim that beauty is everywhere waiting to be unearthed, and when we will curse the fogs of ignorance. Lent helps us find a way to be still so we may better hear the voice which speaks into darkness and fog and tells us who we really are.

And what is it, that voice in the cloud? It's the voice of Christ which sleeps in our deepest selves. The voice that bids us to follow him into a life of which earthly eyes see only gore, not glory. The voice that calls us to come away from the cares of the world and get lost in the cloud of his transfiguring love. The voice that summons us to walk the way from illumination to resurrection by way of purgation so we may see clearly who we really are.

To see that we are the divine's beloved, created by light to be the light of God to the world. Though the world may see only a dark and lonely road ahead, we are called to live in such a way that the road will be illumined by courageous love, bright intelligence, and undying hope. And if we dare to trust the voice and to follow where it leads, even if it leads to Calvary, we will know for ourselves the glory of transfiguration, for we will see even ourselves for who we truly are. And little by little we will be transformed into his image from one degree of glory to another.
