From the Wardens

Greetings, dear friends, on yet another cold, snowy, but beautiful winter Friday. Do keep warm and be very careful on sidewalks and roads that have ice underfoot.

Parish Council met on Thursday, via Zoom, to accommodate a retreat of Bishops of Toronto and Niagara and their senior staff, meeting in Addison Hall on Wednesday and Thursday. This group, which held an annual retreat in Boston before the pandemic, has been meeting annually at St. Marks since 2021. They attended and participated in our weekly prayer service on Wednesday evening. It is a pleasure to welcome them.

The final draft of the 2025 budget was approved by the Parish Council and is ready to present at the Vestry Meeting which takes place on March 2nd immediately following the 10:30 service. Please plan to join us in Addison Hall.

Andrea Douglas reported that she has been advised that the pie-making team for the Cherry Festival will make 350 pies this year, which is half the usual number. The effort required to make 700 pies has now exceeded the capabilities of the team. The remaining pies will be made by another baker, with details still to be determined.

On a much happier note, our own amazing Trudi Watson will be leading a Treasures Sale this year. She is seeking donations of quality household items, including small pieces of furniture. While there will generally be no sale of clothing this year, haberdashery items such as hats, scarves, and purses in excellent condition are welcome. Coats and jackets will also be received, but, please, no shoes. If in doubt, please give Trudi a call at 905-468-3314.

Trudi also requires storage space for items to keep them clean until the Cherry Festival. They will be cleaned and boxed before storage. If you have a large corner of a garage or basement that might be used, please let her know as soon as possible. This is a very important part of the Cherry Festival. Please help if you can.

Please do not forget that our annual pancake supper will take place on **Shrove Tuesday, March 4 from 5 to 7. The cost is \$15 per person, at the door.** The menu will include vegetarian sausages, as well as the regular meat variety. We hope to see you there!

Finally, the annual meeting of Vestry will take place on Sunday, March 2, following the 10:30 service. Committee reports and financial reports will be circulated in advance.

Kevin Sherlock grew up in Niagara on the Lake but now lives in New Zealand. From time to time he discovers items that might be of interest to current members of St. Mark's parish. This article, from local a newspaper, The Times, from May 10th, 1907, is of particular interest to those who wish to know more about St.Mark's cemetery.

A special meeting of the Vestry of St Mark's Church was held in the Schoolhouse on Monday evening at 8 o'clock and was very well attended by the congregation; the rector presiding and opening the meeting with prayer. The report of the committee to whom was reterred the matter of changing the management of the cametery, was received and adopted. This means that the price of grave lots will be increased from 12% cents square foot to 50 cents. Of the money derived from the sale of lots in the future, two-thirds will be deposited in the Dominion Savings Bank, the interest to be used for upkeep of lots, and any lots sold in the future will not be subject to any charge for upkeep. The change does not affect lots sold before the date of the meeting. These will still be subject to the usual charges for upkeep. It was also decided that in view

It was also decided that in view of the fact that nearly all the available ground has been already taken up, no lots will be sold to persons not bona fide members of St. Mark's congregation. There being no other business the meeting
