So it is cold and miserable! Watching the news, we see war zones, homes and villages demolished, starvation, lives destroyed, families lost or dispersed. All this reaches us while we fuss over the cold and snow. Are we not extremely fortunate?

Bishop Susan Bell has announced the results of a feasibility study on whether to proceed with a major fundraising campaign. There will be no campaign at this time. The study found anxiety, concern, a loss of confidence, a loss of the language of stewardship, and most of all that parishes are still in survival mode because of the "seismic" impact of the pandemic. For these reasons, plus others including a major staff transition in the Diocese's financial team, any campaign will be postponed, possibly for a year or 18 months. Parish Council met Thursday. Among the items discussed was the community calling program where a team of parishioners will reach out to others in the parish. The committee is preparing for its initial 2024 meeting to introduce the new program. Thank you to those who have agreed to participate in this important parish work.

St. Mark's has many committees for various purposes. Some require a rotation of duties such as greeters and counters. Others have weekly responsibilities such as Altar Guild.

Cherry Festival as we all know is a major undertaking. Then there is Property, keeping the gardens tidy, arranging cleanups and looking after maintenance. The volunteer needs are critical. As so many found at the recent house tour lunch and Christmas sale, it is really fun.

Did you know.....



...that Elizabeth Ascher, the woman bestknown for looking after Polish soldiers who were training in Niagara-on-the-Lake during the First World War, will was born in Niagara-on-the-Lake? Mrs. Ascher was educated in the Niagara public schools and high school, and took an active part in the affairs of the town. During the first Great War she took a vital interest in Polish affairs and conducted a press campaign on behalf of the Polish army and the Polish nation. She collected money and clothing for Polish relief, and later for orphanages in Poland. In recognition of this service she was made a life member of the Polish White Cross Society, the Women's Section of the National Polish Relief Committee and other organizations. She was awarded the Polonia Restituta, the highest

civilian honour the government of Poland could give.

"The funeral of the late Mrs. E. C. Ascher, which was largely attended, was held on Wednesday afternoon last, the services at St. Mark's Church and at the graveside in the adjoining churchyard were conducted by

Rev. C. H. E. Smith. The casket bearers were Messrs, W. Patterson and W. W. Whittaker, of Gen. Nelles Branch of the Canadian Legion, and Leon Murszewski, Ignasus Kreinsek, T. Derlukciwicz, John Mucha, G. Borkowski, Frang Kunick, Polish veterans. Among those who attended the obsequies were J. S. Kaszubowski, representing the Polish consul at New York City; Bert Marshall, Earl Pond and Robert Downey, 35th Battalion Association, Toronto; Col. F. E. Fronszak, Health Commissioner of Buffalo; Mesdames T. Przewozna, H. Szejmejol, W. Kulaszewska, N. Hulecmis, F. Bazuiszewska, G. Ptuk and Miss Mary Zagrabska, of the Ladies Auxiliary, Post No. 1 Polish Army Veterans, Buffalo." Published by the Niagara Advance. Thursday, May 15, 1941.





Elizabeth Ascher is buried in St. Mark's Cemetery. Unfortunately, her sir name was misspelled on her headstone. It should read "ASCHER".
