On This Day In History

The Battle of Lundy's Lane

The battle took place a mile west of Niagara Falls and marked the end of a U.S. invasion of Canada during the War of 1812.

After defeating the British in the Battle of Chippewa on July 5, 1814, U.S. troops under General Jacob Brown established their position at Queenston. On the night of July 24-25, British forces led by General Phineas Riall advanced towards Lundy's Lane. On the 25th, Riall was reinforced by troops from Kingston under the command of British General Gordon Drummond.

The U.S. troops advanced, and the battle commenced at 6 PM. For several hours, both sides launched desperate charges against each other in the dusk and darkness. The casualties sustained by both sides were the heaviest of the entire war. With fewer than 3,000 troops, the British suffered 878 casualties, including 84 killed, while the Americans had 853 casualties, with 171 killed. Drummond, Riall, Brown, and American General Winfield Scott were all severely wounded, and Riall was taken prisoner.

By midnight, the U.S. troops, too exhausted to launch another attack, fell back, leaving Drummond's men in control of the battlefield. The British forces were also too exhausted to pursue.

While neither side achieved a decisive victory, the fighting halted the American

advance, prompting them to withdraw to Fort Erie the following day.
