Kosciuszko Military Camp

2025 marks the 108th anniversary of the arrival of the first volunteers at the Kosciuszko Military Camp, which opened in Niagara-on-the-Lake in September 1917. It is also the 106th anniversary of the first Pilgrimage.

From October 1917 to March 1919, a total of 22,395 Polish Americans trained at this camp, aiming to liberate Poland, which had been under foreign occupation since 1795 by Russia, Prussia, and Austria-Hungary. World War I provided Polish Americans with an opportunity to reclaim their homeland after 123 years of

occupation, and their desire for a free Poland fueled their commitment to the Allied cause. In 1917, France, seeking more soldiers, declared its intention to create and fund a Polish Army. Canada agreed to train these recruits, and by September 1917, President Wilson allowed Polish Americans to join this army.

Initially, recruitment centers were strategically established in cities with large Polish communities. By January 1918, the recruitment effort had expanded to include approximately 47 centers worldwide, including locations in Canada, targeting cities like Toronto and smaller Polish communities.


When the camp opened in Niagara-on-the-Lake, the Polish flag was raised and proudly flew until the camp's closure. Since the Polish flag had not been flown for over a century, the soldiers were unsure how it was meant to be displayed, resulting in it being flown upside down for the duration of the camp.

Polish Pilgrimage

This year's Pilgrimage activities will begin at noon with a military inspection of the Veterans' organizations. This will be followed by a Catholic Mass in the cemetery chapel and a parade to the Cenotaph, where wreaths will be laid in honor of the Polish and Canadian volunteers who sacrificed their lives for freedom.



During the summer months, the soldiers would indulge in 'bathing parades'. The Polish Army, sometimes with 1,500 men, headed by their brass and bugle bands, would march through town to the bathing beach near Fort Mississauga.
