#### **An Important Message From the Rector**

On Wednesday, March 19, Gene Anne Smith resigned as People's Warden.

The Canons of the Diocese of Niagara require a special vestry be held within 30 days. Palm Sunday is April 13, so would be inappropriate to hold a special vestry on that day or on any of the subsequent days in Holy Week.

The election will happen on **Sunday, April 6** following the 10:30 service.

No other business will be considered or conducted at the meeting.

Though Wardens are called "Rector's Warden" and "People's Warden," this does not imply any priority or distinction of duties. The two wardens, along with the rector, form the Corporation of the parish with perpetual succession. The difference in nomenclature simply describes how the wardens arrive in office: one is appointed by the rector and the other is elected by the people.

Nominations are now being sought from the parish for this important role. Nominations forms are available in the office. If you would like to nominate someone, please make sure you have their permission.

If you want to know more about the work of the Corporation in general and the Wardens in particular, contact the office.



Lent is a significant period in the Christian faith dedicated to reflection and penitence. During Lent many people engage in daily devotional readings to foster deep soul-searching. Music, too, offers a powerful non-verbal means of accessing one's inner emotions and facilitating a profound introspection of the soul.

To support a musical approach to your Lenten journey, I am providing a daily musical reflection video for each of the 40 days of Lent.

These videos were released on Ash Wednesday, March 5, and will continue until the evening of Palm Sunday. Please click on the photo on St. Mark's website to enjoy a daily organ piece inspired by Lenten hymns and scriptural themes, composed by musicians from the early Baroque period to contemporary times. You will see and hear the organs of St. Mark's, and I will provide a short introduction to each piece for context.

Sundays in Lent are less somber as we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. To represent this, videos of organ music recorded in some of the larger churches in London, Guelph, Toronto, and St. Catharines will be shown.

I invite you to take a moment to share your thoughts on the music we've experienced together. Consider the emotions the pieces stirred within you—did they evoke joy, nostalgia, or perhaps reflection? Did any melodies resonate with a biblical story or touch upon a significant moment in your journey? Your insights are incredibly valuable, and I genuinely want to hear from you.

I hope these musical vignettes become a meaningful part of your Lenten practice.



## A new St. Mark's publication



#### A New St. Mark's Publication

There has been a burial ground in this location since at least 1782, when Leonard Plank, a retired soldier of Butler's Rangers, was interred here. It was, until the mid 1830s, the final resting place of all the town's people, young and old, ordinary, and prominent. More than 2,000 of them lie here in this idyllic plot of land, not far from Fort George and overlooking the mouth of the mighty Niagara. Monuments of every size, of marble, granite, slate, and of many styles proclaim the stories of lives lived. This is an extraordinarily historic, and beautiful place and one of significance for all Canadians.

Cosmo Condina, a prominent photographer of international reputation, grew up in our town and knows the cemetery well. During the summer of 2024, encouraged by Sally Mitchell, his trusty Hasselblad in hand, he focused his trained and astute eye and so captured images, not only of the essence of our cemetery, and its history, but more importantly, he caught the spirit of the lives of those here interred.

This superb fifty-page publication will be digitally printed by Carruthers Printery of Smithville on 100 lb. Creator Silk paper and hardbound with hinge pages stab-stitched by Van Huizen Bindery of St. Catharines. Never has our cemetery been so perfectly captured on film and so professionally presented. Profits from the sale of this publication will aid with St. Mark's Cemetery's ongoing tree maintenance and monument restoration programmes.

We invite interested, and supportive individuals, to become patrons of this unique publication.
