MONUMENT STONE CLEANING REFRESHER COURSE

SATURDAY, MAY 31 10:00 AM - NOON

We will review stone cleaning procedures on May 31st. Notes from last year and a cemetery map will be provided. We will then begin cleaning!



What to Bring:

- A bucket
- Rubber gloves
- Various soft-bristle brushes (can be purchased at a dollar store)
- A spray bottle
- A toothbrush for cleaning the inscriptions
- Comfortable shoes or boots
- A small bench or stool (for work at the base of the monument)
- Water and a hat (depending on the weather)

Important Note:

Please avoid using brushes with metal bristles.

Stone cleaning is a gentle, labor-intensive process that utilizes eco-friendly products. I will have several bottles of Dawn dishwashing liquid (non-concentrated), D2, 3% hydrogen peroxide, and two dozen spray bottles. Hydrogen peroxide is used sparingly—one bottle should last for several months. You may want to bring your own the next time.

Last year was exciting as we uncovered inscriptions and designs hidden under moss! In late September, we cleaned nine stones in the West Block, including Crouch, McBride Sarah, Monaghan, Grier Jane, Grier John, baby Grier (William), the McKee twin stone, McKee Maria, and Rolph in the Centre Block.

What happened today in Canadian history?

The North West Mounted Police Force of Canada was established on May 23, 1873.

The first official description of the badge for officers was published on January 24, 1890.

The badge features a wreath, made of maple leaves, and a ribbon that says "Canada" at the top. Above the wreath sits a crown, symbolizing the oath to uphold the Crown's peace, and beneath it, the words "North West Mounted Police" are displayed. (The badge was given the title "Royal" in **1904.)** Inside the wreath is an oval containing the phrase "Maintien le droit," which translates to "maintain the right" in English. This surrounds a buffalo head.

Why a buffalo head?

Assistant Commissioner Macleod was impressed by the vast herds of prairie buffalo. He thought it would be a "splendid" idea to include the buffalo head as part of the badge.
