May 9, 1914

President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation establishing the first national **Mother's Day**

to celebrate America's mothers.

The idea for a "Mother's Day" is credited by some to Julia Ward Howe (1872) and by others to Anna Jarvis (1907), who both suggested a holiday dedicated to a day of peace.

Many individual states celebrated Mother's Day by 1911, but it was not until Wilson lobbied Congress in 1914 that

Mother's Day was officially set on the second Sunday of May.

Wilson stated in his first Mother's Day proclamation that the holiday offered a chance to "[publicly express] our love and reverence for the mothers of our country."

The idea quickly gained traction and spread to Canada.

Canada embraced Mother's Day in its contemporary form in the early 20th century.

The Canadian government officially recognized Mother's Day in 1914.

Happy Mother's Day to all moms, stepmothers, fathers who fill both roles, and friends who love and nurture us as our mothers once did.
