Finally, as promised, our **Stewardship Package** is ready for delivery. We hope each of you will take the time to carefully review the material enclosed and give thoughtful consideration to your contributions to St. Mark's for next year. If it appears that the mail strike will continue beyond next week, we plan to deliver the packages to most of our parishioners by hand.

COMMUNICATION SURVEY RESULTS

We received ten (10) responses and people were overwhelmingly in favour of receiving communication via email and E-News. Thank you for your participation. Based on the low response rate a change in how we communicate is not warranted at this time.

CEMETERY UPDATE

We have completed the fall cleanup of leaves and small branches, grass cutting, and pruning of trees and shrubs.

The cemetery is now closed for the burial of cremated remains (in urns or loose). The ground is too hard to be dug by hand.

Full burials can continue throughout the winter as heavy equipment (front-end loader) is used.

Depending on the winter we plan on May 1st as the opening date for the burial of cremated remains in 2025. This date may be earlier if we have a mild winter.

The monument restoration programme resulted in the restoration of 31 markers as well as another 13 done in the fall.

Two new installations were commemorative: one to recognize Major Benjamin Geary's bravery on Hill 60 Ypres Belgium and the Morrison marker "Chopping Block", one of the most recognizable markers in our cemetery.

Now that the leaves are gone, it is a perfect time to walk through the cemetery to enjoy its beauty and solitude.


