From the Rector

No one likes change—or so we're told. This seems to be especially true in Anglican circles. Which is why I'm proud to be rector of a community which takes liturgical change in stride. Over the past few months, we've been gradually expanding the way we sing the psalms and our repertoire of hymns. That's a very good thing, especially where hymns are concerned. So often we forget that the "golden oldies" were once new. And are maybe not that old to begin with. For example, the beloved tune for that old stalwart "For All the Saints" was composed only

in 1906.

Speaking of All Saints, I am going to make a few changes to the liturgy on All Saints Sunday —November 3. Nothing too drastic! But parts of the Book of Alternative Services haven't worn well. The collects in particular are sometimes insipid and frequently clunky. Likewise the prayers over the gifts and the post communion prayers. Both of these are optional, and I'm going to start omitting them. Well, that's not quite true. A prayer after communion is mandated but the ones we've been using aren't. So we'll start either using the one in the BAS which begins "All your works praise you, O God, and your faithful servants bless you," or one drawn from liturgies used in other parts of the Anglican Communion. As for the collects, I'm going to use—at least from time to time—the supplemental collects that were approved for use by General Synod in 2019. It's true that not all of these are masterpieces, but at least they give us some more options.

We're also going to continue introducing new music for the Eucharist. The New Plainsong of David Hurd had become ubiquitous for us—and don't get me wrong. I love it. David is one of my mentors and a dear friend. But we really need to become familiar with more musical settings, and that's what Michael Bloss is doing, and will continue to do.

Also speaking of All Saints, on All Saints Sunday we have traditionally included in the Prayers of the People the names of parishioners, and friends and family of parishioners, who have died in the last year, that is since **November 1 2023**. There's sometimes confusion about this—we restrict the list to *folks who have died in the last 12 months* in order to keep it from getting too long. 
