In other business, **Carolyn Porter** reported on **World Day of Prayer** preparations for the service on **March 6, 2026, at St. Mark's.** World Day of Prayer is an international, ecumenical gathering of women for a common day of prayer, and is a meaningful and moving service. We are pleased to report on significant improvements to the livestream of the Sunday worship service, thanks to the initiative and technical expertise of Josh Kuhn, who is behind the camera each week.
